



## Appointed Board Members and Pension Credit

Senate Bill 107 was signed into law on July 24, 2013. It changes the definition of an employee so that “an individual whose initial appointment to a gubernatorial board, council or commission occurs after June 30, 2013, shall not be considered employed on a regular part-time basis.” This change was made due to a recommendation of the Joint Sunset Committee.

Therefore, board members first appointed after June 30, 2013 will not receive pension service credit for their time.

Organizations newly hiring gubernatorial-appointed board, council, or commission employees after June 30, 2013, must update the Pension Indicator field on the Del Posn Data page in Position Data to “Bd/Council” prior to processing the hire/rehire in PHRST. Organizations with active board members in a gubernatorial appointed position hired after June 30, 2013, that are incorrectly identified as eligible for pension will be contacted by PHRST for data clean-up.
